## Itinerary

23<sup>rd</sup> July – Arrive Bogota.

24<sup>th</sup> July – La Vega & Laguna Tabacal. Drive to RNA El Paujil.

## 24<sup>th</sup> July – La Vega & Laguna Tabacal. Drive to RNA El Paujil.

After a nice breakfast at the Sheraton Hotel in Bogota, we met our driver Luis who would be with us for the rest of the tour. We began with a short visit to a site called Laguna Tabacal near the town of La Vega. A small lake surrounded by some dry forest. Getting out of the vehicle in the car park, we were surrounded by birds. In a short period of time we had seen **Spectacled Parrotlet**, **Red-crowned Woodpecker**, **Streak-headed Woodcreeper**, **Bar-crested Antshrike**, gorgeous **Blue-necked Tanagers** and **Green Honeycreepers**, **Streaked Saltator** and a striking male **Yellow-faced Grassquit**. We walked down to the lake where we added **Ringed Kingfisher** and **White-throated Crake**. Birding the forest took a little more effort, but we were rewarded with **White-vented Plumeleteer**, **Red-rumped Woodpecker**, **Plain Antwren**, **White-bellied Antbird** and **Rufous-breasted Wren**. I had only planned 1 hour here as we had a long drive ahead of us, but with all the bird activity, we had spent 2 hours before we managed to drag ourselves away.



We stopped for a nice lunch of local fish in Honda (the hottest town in Colombia) where the ceiling fan gave us a welcome break from the intense heat. We carried on along the highway crossing the large Rio Magdalena a couple of times before turning onto a rough road towards the small town of Puerto Pinzon. Here the birding improved but still with far to go we had to control ourselves.



In some marshy areas we saw **Rufescent Tiger-Heron**, **Capped Heron**, **Bare-faced Ibis**, **White-headed Marsh-Tyrant** & **Black-capped Donacobius**. In the open forest habitat we added **Lineated Woodpecker**, **White-fringed Antwren**, **Chestnut-fronted** and the magnificent **Blue-and-yellow Macaws**. Last but not least the huge **Northern Screamer** which had already gone to roost. The drive had been longer than anticipated and the fact that the water level in the river was so low meant that we had a 30 minute walk in, in the dark. Luckily a sturdy horse was on hand to carry in our luggage. Our evening meal and an early night were most welcome after a long first day.

## 25<sup>th</sup> July – Birding RNA El Paujil.

After an early breakfast we walked along towards the Lomo Patoco trail. At the start we saw **Plain-colored** & **Swallow Tanagers**, **White-eared Conebill** and many hummingbirds including **Rufous-breasted Hermit**, **Blue-tailed Emerald** and **Blue-chested Hummingbird**. We walked along the trail which was rather steep in places picking up more and more birds as we went along. **Plumbeous Kite**, **Stripe-throated Hermit**, **Scrub Greenlet** and **Yellow-olive Flycatcher** were fine additions. Due to some imaginative fence-making, I was thrown a little and missed a turn that ended up stretching our morning stroll into an arduous hike. The slight detour did mean that we saw a lot of extra birds however, including **Violaceous Trogon**, **Long-billed Starthroat**, **Red-billed Emerald**, **Rufous-tailed Jacamar**, a group of very smart **Black-chested Jays**, **White-shouldered Tanager** and one of the reserve's star birds, the endemic **Sooty Ant-Tanager**.

After the long morning, we decided to take it a little easier in the afternoon. After lunch we spent some time around the feeders and saw **White-necked Jacobin**, **White-vented Plumeleteer** and **Violet-crowned Woodnymph**. A pair of **Common Tody-Flycatchers** were ever present and seemed to be making a nest near the dining area. A noisy group of huge **Greater Ani** flew in and gave us good views and we also had a nice pair of **Lesser Kiskadees** perched on branch by the river. We set off on a light stroll along the river and found an attractive **Amazon Kingfisher**. Before we had gone too far I heard the unmistakable and incessant calls of antbirds. We were very close to a great antswarm attended by **Bicolored** & **Bare-crowned Antbirds**. **Plain-brown Woodcreeper** and **Gray-headed Tanager** were also in attendance and we had a great time watching and photographing them all. A **White-fronted Nunbird** and **Cinnamon Woodpecker** also came in for a look.



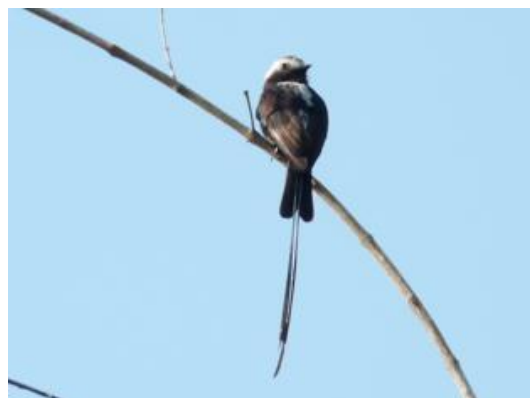
## 26<sup>th</sup> July – Birding RNA El Paujil.



After yesterday's lengthy hike birding from a nearby viewpoint seemed the ideal way to start the next day. Unfortunately Alice surpassed herself by twisting her ankle on completely flat ground. We took her back to the dining area and installed her in front of the hummingbird feeders with ice on her ankle. We then set off again for the mirador. We saw flyovers of **Orange-winged Parrot**, an elusive **Gray-chested Dove**, **White-tailed Trogon**, **Barred Puffbird**, **Red-rumped Woodpecker**, a skulking **Great Antshrike** and some nice **Yellow-backed Tanagers**. We went back to check on Alice who was quite happily watching hummers and other birds close by so we left her again to check out a nice flat trail along a stream bed. The main target in the reserve, the Blue-billed Curassow

had been seen around here before but of course seeing it requires a large amount of luck. We did see some nice flycatchers though, including **Forest Elaenia**, **Sepia-capped Flycatcher**, **Slate-headed Tody-Tyrant** (mating) and **Olivaceous Flatbill**. Activity in general was pretty quiet. Going back to check on Alice, we found her up and about already and said she had just had an immense flock nearby, seeing far more birds than we had. We went back to the spot but the flock appeared to have moved on. We did find a pair of spectacular **Crimson-crested** Woodpeckers, a huge Ringed Kingfisher, a lucky Little Tinamou and some Chestnut-mandibled Toucans but it was pretty quiet in general.

After lunch we took the scope and spent a good while by the small pond near the mirador. Here we had better views of many of the same birds we had seen already, but also great scope views of **American Pygmy Kingfisher** plus **Long-tailed Tyrant**, **Streaked & Panama Flycatchers**. We went back to the mirador in the evening and had a brief flyby of **Saffron-headed Parrots** in poor light. Better view desired.



## 27<sup>th</sup> July – Birding RNA El Paujil. Drive to Cisneros. Birding en route at Zambito toll station.

After an early breakfast, where we were joined by a pair of **Buff-rumped Warblers**, we walked out to the mirador. Here we had fly overs of **Mealy & Blue-headed Parrots** and **Orange-chinned Parakeets** as well as close views of **Black-throated Mango**, **Fulvous-vented Euphonia** and **Blue Dacnis**. **Channel-billed Toucan** finally showed well, and a distant wasp nest on closer inspection turned out to be a **Three-toed Sloth**. We took a short walk up the Lomo Patoco trail and finally found a stunning male **Ruby-topaz Hummingbird**. Walking back down we saw both **Straight-billed & Streak-headed Woodcreepers**. From here we started the walk back



to the vehicle at the road. We took plenty of breaks on the way up and got good views of **White-bearded Manakin**, **Pale-bellied Hermit**, a beautiful **Black-bellied Wren** and large, strange-looking Black Vulture which turned out to be a juvenile **King Vulture**. Some unscheduled road works in Puerto Pinzon meant that our vehicle had to be towed through mud while we got out to look at **Black-crowned Tityra**, **White-winged Swallow & Cattle Tyrant** on the town soccer field. We got going again with just a few birding breaks along the way. **Savanna Hawk & Laughing Falcon** both perched out in the open and a stop at a marshy area produced **Mouse-colored Tyrannulet** and **Large-billed Seed-Finch**. For

lunch we parked in the shade and spotted a few water birds along the river and some attractive **Yellow-hooded Blackbirds** and **Fork-tailed Flycatchers**.

Driving a few hours we stopped at a wetland area and spent a while scoping the large number of waterbirds. We had more **Northern Screamers**, many **Black-bellied Whistling-Duck**, some **Masked Ducks**, **Cocoi Heron**, **Roseate Spoonbill**, **Wood Stork**, a **Lesser Yellow-headed Vulture** in great light, a pair of **Crested Caracaras**, **Wattled Jacana** and a very dapper-looking **White-headed Marsh-Tyrant**. We arrived in the town

of Cisneros in the evening and enjoyed a wholesome Colombian meal in the restaurant. The drive to the next reserve was too long to do in a day. We would continue on the next morning.

### 28<sup>th</sup> July – Birding Cisneros. Drive to RNA Arrierito Antioqueño. Birding en route at Porce.

We met in the garden for a spot of birding before breakfast. The grounds of the hotel were very birdy and in the nearby trees we saw **Black-throated Mango, Yellow-bellied Elaenia, Common Tody-Flycatcher, Crimson-backed & Blue-necked Tanager, Buff-throated & Grayish Saltators, Thick-billed Euphonia** and **Crested Oropendola**. On the river we had nice views of **Amazon Kingfisher & Black Phoebe**. We had a traditional Colombian breakfast of rice & beans, cheese, eggs and arepa while watching a **Cattle Tyrant** walking around on the lawn. We continued our journey stopping en route at the Porce reservoir where we saw several **Striated Herons, Great & Snowy Egrets, Ringed & Amazon Kingfishers, Pale-breasted Spinetail, Yellow-bellied, Ruddy-breasted & Gray Seedeaters**.



We arrived at the RNA Arrierito Antioqueño or Chestnut-capped Piha reserve and were greeted by Carlos Julio, the reserve coordinator, and his wife Luz., who was to be our cook. After a delicious lunch, we spent some time at the hummingbird and tanager feeders working our way through the large selection of species. At the hummingbird feeders we saw some stunning hummers including **Green-crowned Brilliant, Violet-crowned Woodnymph, Andean Emerald** and **Steely-vented Hummingbird**. Amongst the more common tanager species we saw **White-lined, Blue-necked & Scrub Tanagers**. Also in the garden were **Yellow-bellied Siskin** and **Lesser Goldfinch**. In the afternoon we set off on



the Motmot Trail which we were to become well acquainted with. At the beginning of the trail we saw **Greenish Puffleg** and **Bronzy Inca** feeding on an Inga tree in full flower. Further inside the forest we started to see mixed flocks including **Wedge-billed & Olive-backed Woodcreepers, Plain Antvireo, Slaty Antwren, Slate-throated Redstart & Three-striped Warbler**. Other interesting forest birds included Scale-crested Pygmy-Tyrant, White-throated Spadebill, **Chestnut-capped Brush-Finch** and a flock of lovely **Green Jays**. At night we had great views in the garden of **Tropical Screech-Owl**, but everybody was too tired to join me for my long trek into the forest to see the rare **Cinnamon Screech-Owl**.

### 29<sup>th</sup> July – Birding RNA Arrierito Antioqueño.

On our first full day in the reserve we decided to walk to the highest point in the trail in search of rare endemics. At the very start of the trail we found a flock of the stunning **Red-bellied Grackles** mixed with **Green Jays**. A little further on attractive **Green Hermit**. We started seeing mixed flocks and in the first of these added **Smoky-brown Woodpecker, Buff-fronted Foliage-gleaner, Blue-winged Mountain-Tanager** and **Yellow-throated Bush-Tanager**. Nearby, another endemic, **Parker's Antbird**. The very rare **Chestnut-crowned Gnateater** hopped into view for the guide but only one other person caught a glimpse of this elusive species and it refused to come out with the tape. We continued climbing higher taking well-deserved rest stops on the strategically-placed benches - seemingly 1 for each target species. The endemic **Chestnut-capped Piha** showed at one and the beautiful **Purplish-mantled Tanager** at the next. At the top of the ridge we looked for the ridge-top forest specialist, the endemic Black-and-gold Tanager but it was nowhere to be seen. We had a brief flyover of a **Black Hawk-Eagle** but it was little consolation. More flocks on the way back down, adding **Olivaceous Piculet, Streak-necked Flycatcher, Ornate Flycatcher** and **White-winged Becard**.



In the afternoon, we thought it wise to walk along the flat road to a small lake. Here we saw **Pale-breasted Spinetail** and had scope views of a stunning pair of **Blackish Rails** stood out in the open for several seconds. White-throated & Russet-crowned Crakes were vocal but predictably difficult to see.

The highlight of the afternoon though was not a bird but a group of soldiers passing by who agreed to let us take our photo with them.

### 30<sup>th</sup> July – Birding RNA Arrierito Antioqueño.



Today was our mop-up day and we still had several major targets still to see. The Motmot Trail appeared to be our best chance so we hiked up the by now familiar trail in search of them. We got off to a fantastic start when a group of **Chestnut Wood-Quail** scurried across the trail. Not all of us got a look, so I used my patented ‘wood-quail’ technique to coax them back. More flocks added more species to our already impressive trip list: **Golden-olive Woodpecker, Ash-browed Spinetail, Spotted Barbtail, Variegated & Marble-faced Bristle-Tyrants, Slaty-capped & Pale-edged Flycatchers**. At the ridge, again no **Black-and-gold Tanagers** but great views of 2 adult **King Vultures** and an **Ornate**

**Hawk-Eagle**. On the walk back down the activity was still kicking despite the late hour. More flocks added **Collared Trogon, Red-headed Barbet, Streaked Xenops, Golden-winged Manakin, Rufous-naped Greenlet, Russet-crowned Warbler, Speckled, Beryl-spangled, Golden & best of all the breath-taking endemic Multicolored Tanager**. Some of us got views of the endemic **Stiles's Tapaculo** but all of us got great views and photos of the beautiful **Golden-breasted Fruiteater**.

In the afternoon we took another walk out to the lake and added **Bran-colored Flycatcher**. The Russet-crowned Crake was enticingly close but chose to stay hidden despite my best efforts. In the evening we took a walk 5-minute down the road to try for the **Lyre-tailed Nightjar**, but we were left unsatisfied with a brief view of just a female.



### 31<sup>st</sup> July – Birding RNA Arrierito Antioqueño. Drive to Jardin.

Sharon had been unlucky with the tapaculos yesterday so we had a special trip up into the forest to look for them. We heard **White-crowned** straight away but had to climb down into the forest before we got a look. **Stiles' Tapaculo** took longer as it is found higher up the trail. We almost gave up but heard it called and again crawled inside the tangly forest before catching a couple of quick glimpses of this endemic. On the way back to the finca we came across a nice mixed flock including the attractive **Bay-headed & Silver-throated Tanagers**. After breakfast, we all took a walk out to the lake area to try again for some of the birds we were still missing. On the way we had a brief view of a beautiful **Crimson-rumped Toucanet**. At the lake, the Russet-crowned



Crake responded again but didn't come in. We did get good views of the interesting **Black-faced Tanager** before our driver came to pick us up. Back at the finca we loaded our bags into the vehicle and said our goodbyes to Carlos Julio and Luz who had been wonderful hosts before starting the long drive to Jardin. Before leaving we were treated to a flyover of another **Ornate Hawk-Eagle**. We stopped on route for some nice local fish and arrived in the afternoon to take a stroll around the beautiful plaza. The ladies joined me in some fun shopping for tomorrow's supplies. We also had dinner in the plaza and enjoyed watching the locals in cowboy hats showing off on their horses.

### 1<sup>st</sup> August – Birding RNA Loro Orejiamarillo & Jardin area.

We had our earliest start of the trip this morning. Leaving at 4am to catch the magnificent **Yellow-eared Parrots** before they left their dormitory, about an hour and a half's drive along a bumpy round. We arrived in plenty of time and stood on a hill top as the day started to dawn. As the light improved, we watched through the scope at groups of the parrots huddled on the fronds of their favored wax palm. They started stretching and allopreening and we had fantastic eye-level views of this critically endangered species. We saw groups leaving their dormitories in the distance, and all of a sudden around 40 birds dropped out of the tree we were watching. Far more than we thought were there. All in all we saw an estimated 100 individuals - around a quarter of the

global population. We had a bit of breakfast and drove up to the house at the reserve where we saw **Black-billed Mountain-Toucans** calling to each other on distant hillsides. We also had a flyby in great light of around 30 **Speckle-faced Parrots**. We watched **Tourmaline Sunangels** and **Collared Incas** on the feeders and a stunning male **Purple-backed Thornbill** on nearby flowers before starting along the trail in the reserve. At the beginning of the trail was a mirador with a great view over the valley and the town below. A pair of **Lacrimose Mountain-Tanagers** kept us amused. The trail was steep and slippery but our efforts were rewarded with a great view of **Slate-crowned Antpitta**. Sharon was still eager to see tapaculos and dutifully crawled inside the forest for a well-deserved view of **Blackish Tapaculo**.



We started birding along the road back down to town and soon found mixed flocks containing **Yellow-vented Woodpecker**,

**Pearled Treerunner**, **Black-capped Tyrannulet**, **Black-capped & Superciliaried Hemispinguses**, **Gray-hooded Bush-Tanager**, **Blue-backed Conebill**, **Golden-fronted Redstart**, **Slaty Brush-Finch** and **Citrine Warblers**. A nice **Yellow-bellied Chat-Tyrant** didn't want to be left out and sat quietly hawking insects on a branch nearby. We continued birding down the road, gradually picking up more good birds like **Black-throated Tody-Tyrant**, **Hooded Mountain-Tanager**, **Grass-green Tanager**, **Stripe-headed Brush-Finch** and **Mountain Caciques**. Further down we tried for the endemic Munchique Wood-Wren but only managed to find the common **Gray-breasted Wood-Wrens** and an attractive pair of **Slaty-backed Chat-Tyrants**. A pair of **Chestnut-crested Cotingas** had recently fledged a chick lower down and I hoped the family might still be hanging around the same area. Our local guide Carlos indicated the spot and a few minutes later I heard the characteristic nasal call and spotted a beautiful pair in the bare branches of a tall tree nearby. We all had terrific scope views and even got some digiscoped shots. At a stream lower down we had good views of a smart **White-capped Dipper** flying up the stream and after a great scope view of a female **Hook-billed Kite**, we decided to call it a day and head back down to town.



## 2<sup>nd</sup> August – Birding RNA Loro Orejamarillo & Jardin area. Drive to Medellin. Birding around hotel.

It was our last morning in Jardin and we decided to go up the same road towards the reserve to look for some of the birds we had missed. On the way up we saw a **Blue-crowned Motmot** fly across the road and bizarrely perch in a Eucalyptus tree. We tried again without luck for the Tanager Finch but did get great views of a beautiful male **Golden-headed Quetzal**. We had more great flocks throughout the morning and added a few



extra species from yesterday including: **Streaked Tuftedcheek**, **Striped Treehunter**, **Rufous-breasted Flycatcher**, **Rusty-winged Barbtail**, **Russet-crowned Warbler**, **Barred Becard**, **Brown-capped Vireo**, **Green-and-black Fruiteater**, **Metallic-green**, **Purplish-mantled & Blue-capped Tanagers**, **Capped Conebill** and **Oleaginous Hemispingus**. Alice finally got on **Rufous-headed Pygmy-Tyrant** after missing it several times. Other interesting tyrant flycatchers were **Streak-throated Bush-Tyrant** and **Rufous-crowned Tody-Tyrant**. Of several hummingbirds we saw, an interesting very orange-colored race of **Speckled Hummingbird** was new. On our last stop we found a tree full of white berries at eye-level, attracting **Blue-winged Mountain-Tanagers** & the

beautiful **Saffron-crowned Tanagers**. Our time was up, and we went back to town to check out and have lunch. On the way to Medellin we stopped at an indigenous cooperative to buy souvenirs.

Arriving in Medellin, we decided to try without luck for the endemic Grayish Piculet in a residencial area behind the hotel. There were a lot of birds for a city here and we had good views of **Ruddy Ground-Dove**, **Chestnut-collared Swift**, **Black-throated Mango**, **Rufous-tailed Hummingbird**, **Yellow-bellied Elaenia**, a

beautiful male **Vermilion Flycatcher**, **Streaked Saltators** and a new bird for our list, the **Giant Cowbird**. We had a delightful meal in the hotel reminiscing about our trip.

### 3<sup>rd</sup> August – Flight to US

Another early start - this time to catch the flight to Miami. We had all thoroughly enjoyed our trip and seen some of Colombia's incredible diversity and the kindness of its people.
